 Research similar schools or institutions that have had successful BYOD plans. Ask key questions. Learn from their successes and failures.

Three

• Integrate digital citizenship into curriculum.

Four

Review and establish and/or revise policies and procedures.

Five

• Start small - Find your best pioneers to test out your program.

Six

• **Partner** to find relevant content and best practices from IT Management companies, other schools, higher education or regional providers.

Seven

• Define successes up-front and make plans to measure progress.

Eight

• **Identify** necessary resources - training, infrastructure, curriculum and instruction.

Nine

 Assess your existing IT systems. Do you need wireless upgrades? More storage capacity? Help Desk services?

Ten

• Focus on Teaching and Learning.
